ORIGIN.

It is said by some that “Sticks” originated in the Yellow (or Wine) Press, but this is a disputed point, and whatever be the true origin the following facts are undisputed.

On Thursday, March 21st, 1907, there foregathered at the Hotel Russell, London, at the round table:—

After a somewhat lengthy discussion of food and liquid, the meeting adjourned to the Empire Theatre, Leicester Square, where some adventures

were met with, Mr. F. W. ORR, who, unfortunately, had lost his cigar at the Hotel Russell, in particular distinguishing himself, covering himself with glory—no, cigar ashes. A pleasant evening terminated in a short further discussion over important subjects at the Trocadero.

FORMATION.

On the 10th March, 1908, there met at Hatched's Restaurant, Piccadilly, the following of those mentioned above, viz. :—G. E. WINTER, P. COLLINS, S. H. SHOVELLER, T. A. RAWLINSON, S. H. S. HAYNES and F. W. BROWN, when the following resolutions were unanimously passed :—

- (1) That a Club consisting of those gentlemen present at the round table on March 21st, 1907, should be formed for the purpose of mutual recreation at hockey matches and dinners, and other necessities of civilisation.
- (2) That Messrs. G. E. WINTER and P. COLLINS draw up the proposed rules and regulations of the Club.

- (3) That the first match be played *v.* Folkestone on April 11th, 1908.
- (4) That the Club meet that evening at the Royal Pavilion Hotel, Folkestone, to approve the rules and regulations and for other business.
- (5) That Messrs. E. L. CLAPHAM, GERALD LOGAN, P. M. REES and C. H. EILOART, be asked to attend such meeting as the first ordinary members.

Finally, the health of the new Club was drunk with much enthusiasm in Scotch ale, this being recommended by Mr. SHOVELLER as a sound training beverage.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. The name and style of the Club is "STICKS."

1A. The colours of the Club shall be white shirts and blue knickers, and the colours may be worn by wives, sisters and daughters of Original Members or Members.

2. The membership is limited as follows :—

3. The Club shall play at least one hockey match and hold at least two general meetings in each year.

3A. No Original Member or Member shall on any occasion play as an opponent of the Club.

4. The Club shall be governed by a Committee, consisting of a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary and a Wine Taster, to be elected at the first general meeting held in each year. The Committee shall all retire annually, but be eligible for re-election. Only Original Members or Members shall be eligible to serve on the Committee or to vote on any subject. Honorary Members can attend meetings but not vote, but Candidates for election can only attend on the invitation of two Original Members or Members.

5. The entrance fee shall be nil and the subscription shall never exceed the entrance fee.

6. Provided that if there are vacancies in the Club, Candidates may be put up for election as Members, or Honorary Members, at any general meeting. No Candidate shall be elected either as a Member or an Honorary Member until he has either played in a match for the Club, or on the invitation of two Original Members or Members attended a general meeting and conducted himself thereat with cleanliness and decorum. One Zingari eye ball the following morning cancels election *ipso facto*.


7. No general meeting of the Club shall be held upon other than licensed premises.

7A. Neither the rules or regulations of the Club, or the names of the Members or Officers shall on any account whatever be disclosed to anyone who is not a Member.

8. Five shall form a quorum at a general meeting and three at a Committee meeting.

9. Candidates for election must take their stand in a hockey goal, in the presence of at least four Original Members or Members, who shall each be entitled to one free hit at goal. Each time

a goal is scored the Candidate shall stand drinks round at the next general meeting; if no goals are scored the Candidate shall certainly not be elected. In the event of a goal not being available, the Candidate shall undergo such other initiation either on the field, or in, upon, or at such licensed premises as the majority of Original Members and Members present shall decide.



Under a Resolution of the Club in General Meeting, passed 27th January, 1910, a "Deferred List" has been started; members transferred to this list do not rank in the "25" mentioned in Rule 2. They may attend meetings if they desire, but the H.S. is not bound to send them notices.
